Why SAFDAC?

- Agriculture critical to every country's well-being by providing food and raw materials
- Sector challenges:
 - Feeding growing global population

 - Effects of climate change
- Smart technologies have potential to: increase productivity; lessen environmental footprint of production; reduce waste; improve decision-making along agri-food value chain

SAFDAC

- Supports development or advancement of smart technologies to:
 - Increase agricultural productivity
 - Reduce cost of production
 - increase value of commodities
- Eligible smart technologies must:
 - Provide solutions to challenges faced by Alberta's agri-food industry
 - Clearly demonstrate economic, environmental and/or social benefits for Alberta

Available Funding

- Total \$2 million CAD
- Each grant up to \$500,000 CAD
- Applicants must provide at least 25% of total eligible costs
- No limit on amount of financial stacking toward Applicant's contribution

Applicant Eligibility

- Small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in agri-food or technology industries; industry associations; post-secondary institutions; public and private R & D labs; not-for-profit orgs
- Must be legally able to execute an Investment Agreement with Alberta Innovates
- Applicants not required to be based in Alberta, but must demonstrate a clear value proposition for the province
- Must be in good financial standing with Alberta Innovates and its subsidiaries, InnoTech Alberta and C-FER Technologies
- Alberta Innovates will perform a corporate search, may also carry out bankruptcy and litigation searches

Partner Eligibility


- Collaboration with Project Partners is highly encouraged, but not required
 - Industry, post-secondary institutions, government, non-for profit, etc.
- Partnership with potential end-users
- Applicants not based in Alberta are encouraged to have Alberta-based Project Partners
- Pages 3-4 in Program Guide



Project Eligibility

- Must align with SAFDAC program objectives (Pages 4-5 in Program Guide)
- Already be between <u>Technology Readiness Levels</u> 3 and 7 at the start of the project
 - Higher start-level TRL projects may also be considered
- Be stepped with milestones (grant payment is based on milestones)
- Be completed by December 31, 2023
- Comply with other criteria that Alberta Innovates may develop from time to time





In-Scope Projects

- Development of new applications for digitalization of the agri-food sector
- Autonomous systems and prototype development that reduce costs and/or improve quality and safety of ag and food products
- Development and validation of new smart technologies and solutions to mitigate impact of biotic and abiotic stress, increase farm productivity and supply chain functionality




Out of Scope Projects

- Conventional agriculture research including biotechnology, agronomy, demonstration and adaptation research
- Marketing or new agri-food product development
- Projects focusing on reduction of greenhouse emissions, mitigation, abatement or sequestration










Expression of Interest

- EOI is different from SAFDAC 2020
- SAFDAC 2021 has same EOI form for all applicants; shorter and simpler
- No limit on submitted EOIs per applicant, but it is a highly competitive process
- Business Plans are not required
- You may attach supporting documents (e.g., business plans, letters of support)
- EOIs and supporting documents must be submitted in Smart Simple




