



TIER Background

- Funded by the Technology Innovation & Emissions Reduction program
- \$50M of funding available from Alberta Innovates
 - Component of the \$750M TIER distribution announced Sept 22
- Program Goals
 - Greenhouse Gas Reduction (immediate & long-term)
 - Job Creation (immediate & long-term) and other Economic Benefits
 - Improve Cost Competitiveness
- Continuous Intake approach processed in "cohorts"
 - Potential for all funds to be distributed in Cohort 1

Project Eligibility – The Dealbreakers

- Must commence within 45 days of funding approval and be complete before March 2023
- Quantifiable economic benefits and GHG reductions
- Aligns with Al Clean Resources program areas
- ≥ 80% of jobs and expenses occur in Alberta
- TRL 4 to 7
- Applicant & Partners provide minimum 25% of project costs (incl in-kind)
- Minimum funding request \$200,000
- Maximum funding request \$5,000,000

Project Eligibility – Strong Considerations

- End User involvement
- Collaboration and Knowledge Sharing
- Matching funding
- Engagement with Alberta's Post-Secondary Institutions
- Direct GHG reductions

Advice for Preparing a Successful Proposal

- Read the Program Guide and the Application Guide
- Use clear and concise language
- Address each question in the application and read the question guidance carefully
- Clearly identify the status quo and competing technologies
- Have a credible and quantifiable GHG reduction narrative
- Have a credible and quantifiable jobs and economic value narrative
- Clearly identify the Alberta impact context
- Don't wait until the last day to submit!

- 2. What types of projects are you seeking?
- 3. Can projects or funding occur outside the province?
- 4. What if our other funding sources aren't secured yet?
- 5. Will there be another opportunity to apply after Nov 30?
